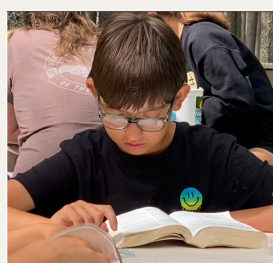
## Women's craft and fellowship weekend June 20-22

## Junior camp - Kingdom Adventures: Learning through Jesus' parables July 6-11

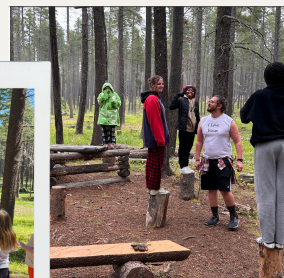

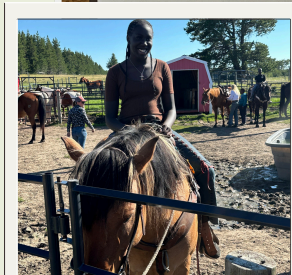
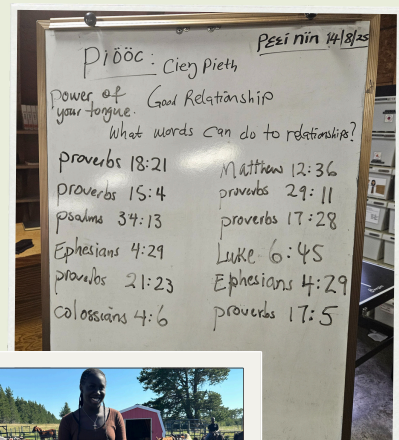
## Teen camp - Camp Harding Adventure Quest July 20-25

At our teen camp, Bishop Helen and campers studied 1 Corinthians 9: 24-27 and competed in team and individual amazing race challenges designed to explore some of what is needed to run the race well: discipline, love/servanthood, perseverance, patience and submission. Dairy Queen gift cards were the prizes for points earned throughout the week! Of course, all the regular camp activities including music, swimming, climbing and horse back riding were on order!



## South Sudanese dinka language camp August 10-15

We welcomed campers aged 10-17 for the second Dinka language instruction camp. The lessons focused primarily on youth self-discovery as a Dinka child, a beloved child of Creator God, and valued member of the community; through daily morning devotion and attendance in language instruction sessions on family interactions and genealogy. In the afternoons, the campers expressed their unique cultural identity through participation in recreational activities, such as horseback riding, wall climbing and tree top drop, and swimming.





The evening campfire stories provided the youth some practical social skills on financial literacy, teaching on love and kindness, and social media interactions, highlighting the impacts of bullying and other forms of violence in relationships.



We were privileged to host the Anglican Church of Canada/Alongside Hope Fire talk gathering at Camp Harding. With a focus on mental health peer mentorship, Anglican worship, indigenous teachings, and fun camp activities, indigenous youth from Manitoba, Alberta and Saskatchewan had the chance to forge new friendships and strengthen their faith.

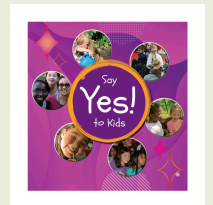
