Equipping Congregations: Children's Summer Day Camps



Over the past several years Living the Mission funds have supported children's summer day camps throughout the diocese. In 2020 COVID-19 changed the delivery of these programs from in-person camps led by CrossTalk staff to online at-home activities. CrossTalk Ministries has since decided that they will not be sending

teams out across the country in the foreseeable future. Rather than letting this vital ministry lapse, discussions are underway to ensure that in the summer of 2021 children will still have an opportunity to sing, create, and play while learning about God.
