Third Sunday of Easter: Living the Mission

"The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our ancestors has glorified his servant Jesus...whom God raised the dead. To this we are witnesses." (Acts 3:13a, 15)

Living the Mission is a partnership between parishes, the diocese and the national church to fund mission initiatives. Money raised is shared between participating parishes (45.8%), diocesan mission initiatives (45.8%) and national/global mission projects (8.4%). The goal is to *Enable, Equip and Engage* the people of the church for mission in rapidly changing world. Even during the Covid pandemic *Living the Mission* impacted people in a positive way. Engaging God's World: Supporting National Indigenous Ministry

MacDonald served as emcee, broadcasting by live video over the Internet while also drawing on pre-recorded video performances submitted by Indigenous Anglicans across Canada.
